**SUBJECT:** Results on the World Bank Study for the Public Expenditure Tracking and Quantitative Service Delivery Survey (PETS-QSDS)

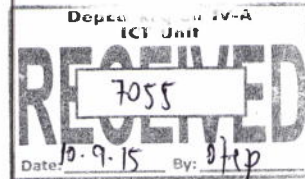
As part of the Technical Assistance and commitment to support the Department of Education's strategic directions on access, quality and governance, the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) or World Bank in partnership with the Government of Australia conducted the study on Public Expenditure Tracking and Quantitative Service Delivery Survey (PETS-QSDS), which focused on the following:

- 1) Resource flow – (i) management of resources and (ii) control mechanisms
- 2) Access and availability of resources – (i) presence of critical inputs at the school and (ii) utilization of resources
- 3) Relationship of resources to school performance, and
- 4) Equity

The study covered nationally representative sample of elementary and high schools within 20 cities (HUCs) and 30 municipalities (excluding ARMM). About 90% of the government's budget (CY 2013) for (i) teacher salaries; (ii) teacher trainings; (iii) MOOE; (iv) SBM; (v) infrastructure/ construction; (vi) learning materials, and (vii) LGU spending on education were tracked. Results of the study will inform future reforms and policies on resource allocation and/or utilization.
