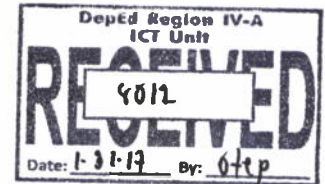

SUBJECT : DEWORMING GUIDELINES FOR 2017 ONWARDS

DATE : January 30, 2017



Herewith are the guidelines for School-Based Deworming for 2017 onwards:

1. July and January of every School Year are designated as Deworming month. Deworming can be done on the most convenient day of the month for the parties involved. However, it is also encouraged that a One-Day Synchronized Deworming be done.
2. The deworming activity shall cover all public school enrolled learners from Kindergarten to Grade 6, Grade 7-12 and SPED in the Region.
3. Objective is to deworm 85% of the above target/eligible population.
4. There should be 4 weeks gap for observation period for any Adverse Events between vaccination and deworming.
5. Private Schools participating in the Mass Deworming Activity (MDA) are encouraged to coordinate with the respective Local Government Units Rural Health Unit (LGU-RHU) for the drug supply, monitoring, recording and reporting.
6. The Division Coordinator/s for Private Schools are to assist the Private Schools in the orientation, monitoring and reporting.
7. The Division and School Deworming Coordinators shall coordinate with the Local Government Units' Rural Health Unit/ City Health Office Personnel for supervision of the activity and monitoring/back referral of any adverse events
8. Cases of adverse events should be referred to Government Hospitals.





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9. Schedule of reporting is as follows:

July Deworming	1 st Friday of August	1 st Thursday of October
