REGIONAL ONLINE TRAINING-WORKSHOP ON WRITING QUARTER 2 SCRIPTS FOR TV-BASED INSTRUCTION

To Schools Division Superintendents

- 1. Pursuant to DM-CI-2020-00244, re: Guidelines on the Development of Learning Resources for Radio-Based Instruction, this Office, through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD), announces the conduct of the Regional Online Training-Workshop on Writing Quarter 2 Scripts for TV-Based Instruction on January 25-31, 2021.
- 2. Television/Radio-Based Instruction (TV/RBI) is a learning delivery modality where televisions and/or radio stations are used as platforms in delivering important learning content. The use of this modality will only be successful when used as supplementary aid and combined with other modalities (PIVOT Learning Continuity Plan, p. 56).
- 3. This activity aims to:
 - a. orient participants on the use of TV as an educational platform;
 - b. train participants on the knowledge and skills needed in preparing TVbased materials; and
 - c. prepare scripts and materials for TV-based instruction (TVI).
- 4. The activity shall be conducted via Google Meet and Google Classroom. The link shall be sent via email to the participants a day before the scheduled sessions.
