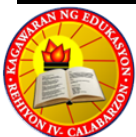

1. Bidders shall provide correct and accurate information required in this form.
2. Price quotation/s must be valid for a period of sixty (60) calendar days from the date of submission of quotation.
3. Price quotation/s, to be denominated in Philippine peso shall include all taxes, duties and/or levies payable.
4. Quotations exceeding the Approved Budget for the Contract shall be rejected.
5. Award of contract shall be made to the Lowest Calculated and Responsive Quotation (for goods and infrastructure) or, the Highest Rated Offer (for consulting services) which complies with the minimum technical specifications and other terms and conditions stated herein.
6. Any interlineations, erasures or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed or initialed by you or any of your duly authorized representative/s.
7. The item/s shall be delivered according to the requirements specified in the Technical Specifications.
8. The Department of Education Region 4A shall have the right to inspect and/or to test the goods to confirm their conformity to the technical specifications.
9. In case two or more bidders are determined to have submitted the Lowest Calculated Quotation/Lowest Calculated and Responsive Quotation, the DBM shall adopt and employ "draw lots" as the tie-breaking method to finally determine the single winning provider in accordance with GPPB Circular 06-2005.
- 10. Payment shall be processed after delivery and upon the submission of the required supporting documents, in accordance with existing government accounting rules and regulations. Please note that the corresponding bank transfer fee, if any, shall be chargeable to the contractor's account.**
11. Liquidated damages equivalent to one tenth of one percent (0.1%) of the value of the goods not delivered within the prescribed delivery period shall be imposed per day of delay. The Department of Education Region IV-A shall rescind the contract once the cumulative amount of liquidated damages reaches ten percent (10%) of the amount of the contract, without prejudice to other courses of action and remedies open to it.

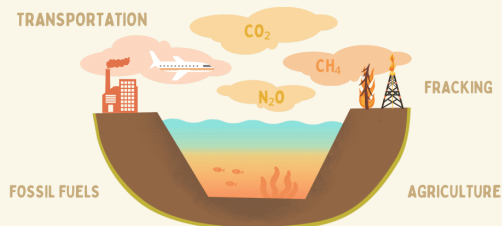

WHAT IS CLIMATE CHANGE?

Climate Change (n.)

a change in climate that can be identified by changes in the mean and/or variability of its properties and that persists for an extended period typically decades or longer, whether due to natural variability or as a result of human activity.



The current climate change we are experiencing is caused by human activities. These activities increase the contribution to greenhouse gas emissions, trapping more heat in the atmosphere. **The evidence for rapid climate change can be seen through:**

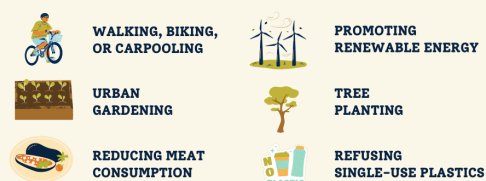


WHAT CAN WE DO TO MAKE CLIMATE COOL AGAIN?

Responding to climate change involves two approaches:

CLIMATE MITIGATION

involves actions that reduce greenhouse gas emissions or increase carbon sinks such as:



CLIMATE ADAPTATION

involves adjustments in natural or human systems to reduce their vulnerabilities to the impacts of climate change and climate-related risks such as:



DID YOU KNOW?

Tree Planting and Growing is both a mitigation and adaptation strategy. For mitigation, trees absorb CO₂ which decreases GHG emissions. For adaptation, it absorbs water which reduces flood and landslides and helps to cool air temperature through transpiration and provision of shade. Trees like mangroves act as a natural barrier to protect coastal communities from storms.

THE PHILIPPINES IS HIGHLY VULNERABLE TO THE EFFECTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE.

This is due to its high exposure to **natural hazards** (cyclones, landslides, floods, droughts), dependence on climate-sensitive natural resources, and vast coastlines where all of its major cities and the majority of the population reside.

In the Philippines, a total of 28 million Filipinos directly suffered from five supertyphoons from 2009 to 2018.

PHILIPPINES' LEADERSHIP IN CLIMATE ACTION

In 2009, the **Climate Change Act** was passed into law to ensure the mainstreaming of climate change into government agencies' policies, plans, and programs. This policy led to the formulation of NCCAP 2011-2028. In 2012, the policy was amended, and the People's Survival Fund was established to provide climate financing.
