
Moreover, participants are requested to take note of the following:

- All participants are REQUIRED to pre-register through https://tinyurl.com/Pre-Reg-TOT-NVSP on or before July 18, 2024.
 - Pre-registration is necessary for the distribution of Certificates and other logistical concerns.
- Arrival and check-in will be on Day 1, July 22, 2024 (Monday). Registration will start at 10:00 AM, followed by Preliminaries at 1:30 PM.
- 3. Check-out will be on Day 5, July 26, 2024 (Friday) at 12:00 PM.
- 4. Transportation service to the venue will **not** be available on Day 1. Public transportation options are available and participants are requested to arrange their own transportation in advance.
- 5. Funds to be used for travel expenses of the participants will be downloaded to the Regional Offices and shall then be forwarded to the Schools Division Offices, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. ROs & SDOs are requested to augment any fund shortages.

The National Vision Screening Act ensures that every learner entering the school system will receive eye (vision) screening test, receive intervention/treatment and follow-up.

III. Objectives

The following are the objectives of National Vision Screening Program (NVSP):

- To conduct simple vision screening test to kindergarten learners through DepEd personnel;
- b. To identify learners with possible visual problems;
- c. To identify early childhood visual problems;
- d. To provide immediate attention to visually impaired kindergarten learners and create a referral system to eye care practitioners;
- e. To develop an integrated vision screening results database for all kindergarten learners; and
- To conduct continuing research on the state of visual impairment among kindergarten learners.

IV. Program Design

A. Availability of Funds

The program will be funded through a combination of national and local government allocations, with potential support from non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and private sector partners. Budget provisions will cover the costs of vision screening tools, training for health personnel, educational materials, among others. It is worth mentioning that in the National Vision Screening Act Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), Section 12. "DepEd, PERI and DOH may establish their respective Vision Screening Research (VSCR) Trust Fund from any donation, grant, bequest, endowment and contribution made to them in favor of the National Vision Screening Program."

TRAINING OF TRAINERS ON THE NATIONAL VISION SCREENING PROGRAM

BULLETIN OF INFORMATION

I. Background

In 2018, the Department of Health (DOH) through the Philippine Eye Research Institute (PERI) conducted the fourth National Survey of Blindness or the Philippine Eye Disease Study (PEDS), which highlighted vision impairment and blindness as a major public health concern in the Philippines. A total of 450,000 Filipinos were afflicted with visual impairment with uncorrected refractive error as the second leading cause (behind cataract) at 0.38%.

In July 31, 2019, Republic Act 11358 or "National Vision Screening Act" was signed into law by President Rodrigo Roa Duterte. The National Vision Screening Program (NVSP), spearheaded by the Philippine Research Institute (PERI), in collaboration with the Department of Health (DOH) and Department of Education (DepEd) as the main implementer, aims to screen all kindergarten learners entering the Filipino school system at age 5 or 6 to detect errors of refraction and amblyopia.

In response to these results, the DOH developed the Philippines 2nd National Prevention of Blindness Program Strategic Plan for 2018-2022. The overall goal of this plan is to ensure that all Filipinos enjoy the right to sight, by reducing the burden of avoidable blindness and visual impairment and ensuring equitable access to a comprehensive package of quality eye care services. The Plan has an ambitious, but achievable target to reduce visual impairment by 25% by 2022.

II. Rationale

Recognizing the critical role of good vision in a child's academic performance and overall development, the NVSP addresses vision problems among school children at an early stage. Early detection and intervention can significantly enhance learning outcomes and quality of life, thereby contributing to the holistic development of learners. The NVSP is an essential component of the Oplan Kalusugan sa DepEd (OKD) under the Medical, Nursing, Dental and Nursing Services.

III. Objectives

- · Improving Knowledge and Skills: Equip trainers with thorough training on vision screening methods, procedures, and the significance of early identification of visual issues in children.
- · Standardizing Training Methods: Ensure consistency and reliability in various screening programs, ensure that trainers are knowledgeable with standardized methods and developing modalities and processes for vision screening.
- Enhancing Screening Accuracy: Provide participants with training on how to effectively perform vision tests, evaluate the findings, and recognize common childhood vision issues.
- Enhancing Teaching Competencies: Make sure trainers are better equipped to instruct and guide other screeners, so they can transfer information and skills with ease.
- Increasing Awareness: Disseminate the importance of children's visual health and the role that early screening prevent long-term vision problems.
- Implementing/sharing/putting Best Practices into Practice: Ensure the best possible service, give trainers access to the most current best practices and guidelines regarding vision screening.
- · Using Screening Tools: Introduce trainers to a range of vision screening tools and technologies, and provide them with instruction on how to use and maintain them properly.
- · Data gathering and Reporting: Ensure that trainers are equipped with the skill on accurate data gathering, recording, and reporting methodologies.
- Creating Networks through partnerships and Support Systems: Promote networking and support systems among trainers so that they can provide technical assistance.

Ensuring Program Sustainability: Provide trainers with tools, such as resource management and community participation, to ensure the long-term viability of the vision screening program.
