Webinar 1: March 1, 2025

**WEBINAR 1: NAVIGATING OLD AND NEW DEPED LANGUAGE POLICIES:  
BRIDGING THE GAP IN TEACHING ENGLISH IN MULTILINGUAL SETTINGS**

This webinar for school administrators shall focus on the current language policies in the Philippine educational system and how a first language-based multilingual strategy in teaching English is prioritized to improve learning outcomes and literacy despite policy-related changes. Key discussions shall include administrative practices that support theory-based curriculum delivery, such as translanguaging techniques in the classroom. The session shall underscore the crucial role of school administrators in aligning pedagogy with policy and creating effective language learning environments that honor local contexts and prepare learners for global opportunities.

Webinar 2: April 26, 2025

**WEBINAR 2: TEACHING STRATEGIES FOR MULTILINGUAL ENGLISH LEARNERS  
(KEY STAGES 1 AND 2)**

This webinar for English teachers in Key Stages 1 and 2 shall focus on evidence-based teaching practices specifically designed for multilingual learners, with an emphasis on early literacy and language development. Key discussions shall include teaching reading strategies for literacy formation and development, leveraging L1 as a resource for L2 acquisition, and fostering communicative competence through real-world contexts. The session is designed to empower educators with adaptable strategies to enhance learners' English proficiency while preserving cultural and linguistic diversity.

Webinar 3: May 31, 2025

**WEBINAR 3: TEACHING STRATEGIES FOR MULTILINGUAL ENGLISH LEARNERS  
(KEY STAGE 3)**

This webinar for English teachers in Key Stage 3 shall focus on teaching techniques that will help develop students' multiliteracies as they navigate different text types, media, and modalities. Key discussions shall include genre-based pedagogy and developing metalinguistic awareness through translanguaging. The session is designed to help teachers design engaging lessons that foster students' capacity to analyze, evaluate, and create texts for a range of audiences, purposes, and contexts.
