**CONTINUOUS QUARTERLY MONITORING ON THE
DISTRIBUTION OF SELF-LEARNING MODULES –
ALTERNATIVE DELIVERY MODE (SLMS-ADM)
FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2025-2026**

To **Schools Division Superintendents**

1. In support of the Department's continuing efforts to provide learners with timely, accessible, and appropriate learning resources, this Office shall implement a Continuous Quarterly Monitoring on the Distribution of Self-Learning Modules – Alternative Delivery Mode (SLMs-ADM) in all public elementary and secondary schools in the region for School Year 2025-2026.
2. This initiative builds upon the initial monitoring and validation activities conducted at the opening of classes. It seeks to ensure sustained availability, proper handling, and equitable distribution of SLMs throughout the school year.
3. The quarterly monitoring shall be conducted by the Regional Monitoring Team in close coordination with the Schools Division Offices (SDOs), guided by the following objectives:
 - a. track the status of SLM-ADM distribution per quarter;
 - b. ensure timely replenishment and redistribution of SLMs when necessary;
 - c. identify recurring issues and best practices in the field;
 - d. support schools and SDOs in aligning with quality standards in learning resource management; and
 - e. generate consolidated regional reports as a basis for policy recommendations and improvement actions.
4. All SDOs are enjoined to conduct their respective division-level quarterly monitoring on the distribution of SLMs-ADM and submit their consolidated reports to the Regional Office during the first week following the end of each quarter (i.e., July, October, January, and April). The reports shall be submitted through the official link provided by the Regional Office.
