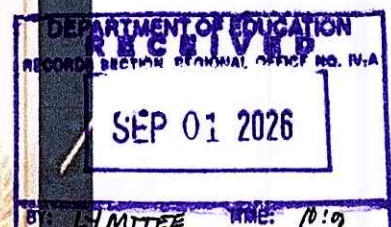

However, psychological distress cannot be separated from a student's gendered experiences, social environment, and sense of safety.

This three-day international training brings together educators, guidance personnel, and school leaders to establish a integrated, trauma-informed framework. By creating synergy between mental health services and GAD principles, schools can move beyond basic compliance toward cultivating affirming spaces that nurture the mind, soul, and identity of every learner.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

1. **Align** school guidance counseling objectives with national Gender and Development (GAD) mandates, child protection policies, and institutional strategic plans.
2. **Identify** early behavioral, emotional, and somatic warning indicators of youth mental health challenges for timely, gender-responsive intervention.
3. **Formulate** an ethical decision-making protocol for student data privacy, mental health records, and complex disclosure scenarios in compliance with legal standards.
4. **Develop** measurable, gender-disaggregated Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) to monitor and evaluate guidance service impact.
5. **Optimize** resource allocation by justifying funding for mental health and guidance initiatives using the mandatory 5% GAD budget allocation.
6. **Strengthen** institutional capacity across all levels of school administration to foster inclusive, trauma-informed, and safe learning environments.

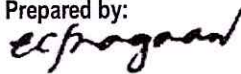
